ANNUAL LUNCH 2023



As the curtain fell on the 2023 racing season, planning started in earnest for the Annual Lunch which was held on Friday 1st December at the Royal Automobile Club in London's Pall Mall. More than 160 members, guests and friends were keen to come together to celebrate a fabulous year and applaud those chosen to receive awards for their achievements both on and off the track.

The lunch was held in the sumptuous and newly re-furbished Mountbatten Room, following a very convivial drinks reception in the Club's Committee Room. Chairman Peter Horsman welcomed everyone and, as tradition dictates, started the ball rolling by awarding the Chairman's Cup to Treasurer Andrew Beaumont in recognition of his superb endeavours with the Association's financial affairs.

A delicious three course meal was then enjoyed by all and, as coffee and petit fours were served, we moved into Peter's review of the season and the announcement of plans for the 2024 racing year. Peter gave fulsome thanks to all those who have worked hard over the year to produce a great programme of racing: sponsors Dunlop – represented by Steve Cox of HP Tyres; Will Nuthall and the team at IN Racing for their work in looking after the Red Truck; Wendy and Bob Beever for the Red Truck catering; Tim and Donna for their tireless work at every race meeting; the Driving Standards team of Chris Wilson, Ted Rollason and Richard Parnell, scrutineer Bertie Gilbart-Smith and Competition Secretary Lindsey Warren. And of course, Stella's massive contribution as she approaches retirement (more of which to follow later in this edition). Peter also introduced the new Membership Secretary Steph Clements, who takes up her role with the HGPCA in January. Last, but by no means least, thanks went to the Board Directors for their support throughout the year.

Competition Secretary Lindsey Warren then took over the microphone to announce the Class Awards for the 2023 season with HGPCA President Clive Chapman (who thankfully had tested Covid-negative that morning after several days of positive results!) stepping up to present the awards which this year were beautiful leather items of luggage. Any award winner not able to make the lunch will be able to collect their Awards from the Red Truck in 2024.

Once the Class Awards had been announced, it was back to Peter to present the 2023 recipients with the HGPCA's Special Awards. As we had been able to run separate races for Front Engine cars at three of the race meetings, it had been decided to award the Nuvolari and Ascari Trophies. First the Nuvolari Trophy – which is presented for Pre 1950 Front Engine cars and went to Stephan Rettenmaier. Then the Ascari Trophy for Post 1950 Front Engine Cars which was shared between John Spiers (Maserati 250F) and Paul Grant (Cooper Bristol).

Bertie Gilbart-Smith then stood up to announce his chosen winner of the trophy presented in the name of the late Alan Putt. Bertie had decided that Hall & Hall should receive the award for their immaculate preparation and presentation of cars racing with the HGPCA this season. Andy Willis collected the trophy on Hall & Hall's behalf.

Which left just the impressive Jack Brabham Trophy to be awarded – to a very surprised, but nonetheless thrilled, Steve Banham for his support throughout the year in his Cooper T45!
